Key Tasks:

- To develop new course content and facilitate class/group work.
- Some styling work required where possible
- Be able to work with various members of a diverse community.
- Adapt patterns and garments creatively and technically.
- Must have a knowledge of sewing and finishing techniques; experience of using an industrial or domestic sewing machine and overlocker.
- This position could lead to paid work for the right applicant.
- Designer must understand design from a technical perspective, i.e. be able to draft and produce patterns and technical specifications
- Amend and upcycle garments with new & creative adaptations. Including Pattern Cutting, Creative Design Principles.
- Have an interest in sustainability and environmental issues and how this feeds back into fast fashion trends and behaviours.
- Knowledge of Adobe Creative Suite
- Knowledge of sewing/overlocking finishes.
